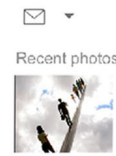

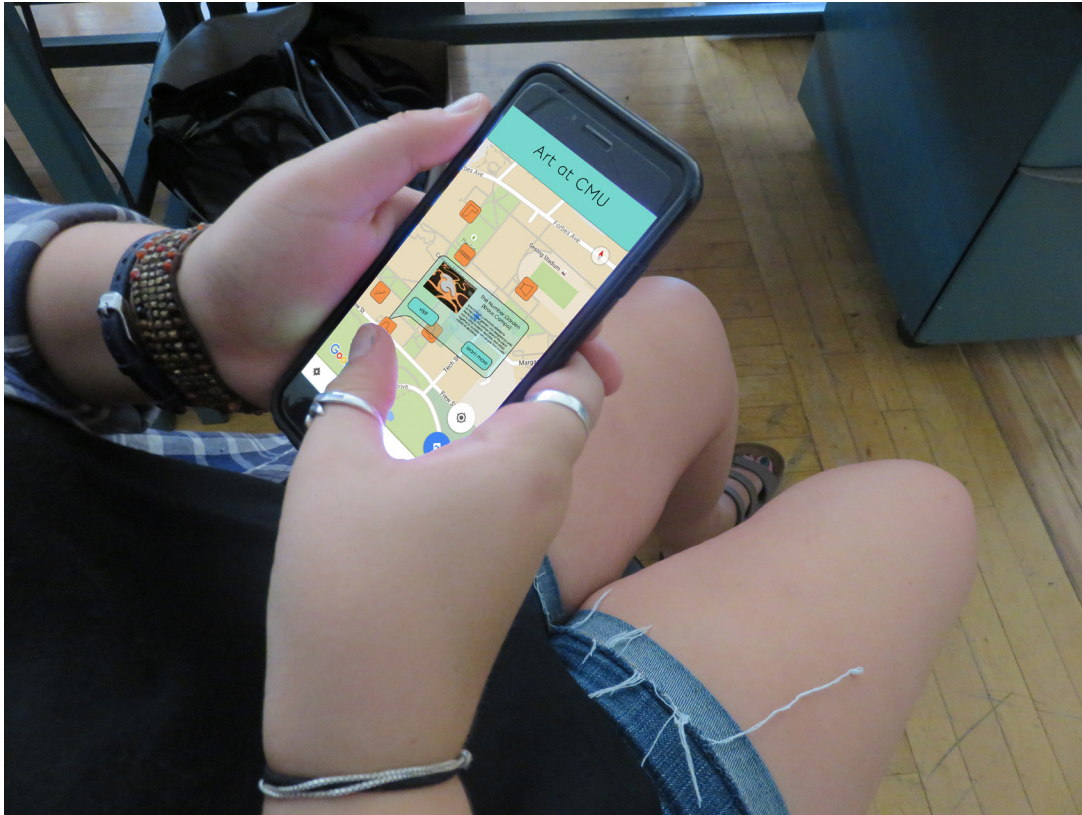

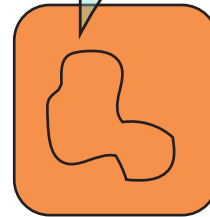


### The Number Garden (Kraus Campo)
